Our topic this term is Beachcombers

Topic

Pack up some sandwiches, pick up a fishing net and keep your eyes peeled because we're off to the coast to go beachcombing! This term we'll look at the sights, sounds and smells of the seashore and observe rock pools to find living and non-living things. We will look at shells, pebbles and seaweed which will help us to learn about a wide range of coastal plants and creatures. We'll read a range of seaside stories and use the seaside as a setting for our writing. Maps and film footage will help us to find out more about the coast and we'll create a wide variety of artwork.

English

This term we will be reading 'The Snail and The Whale' by Julia Donaldson

We will be writing a diary entry from the perspective of the main character. We will continue to expand our language and add to our growing list of new vocabulary. We will also use a wide range of punctuation to ensure that our writing is effective. Finally, we will be embedding features of non-fiction texts and will write a report on Killer Whales.
